Community Facilities, Jeff Sella, Chairman:

MBA Facilities Projects (all costs, where provided, are estimates):

Projects completed:

- Bayberry Storage area enclosure fence now stained
- All gates have been tightened (still a work in process)
- Ditches are being cleared of new plant growth
- Installed Ballards on Short Road
- Repaired dune fencing
- Hired Caswell to clean out culverts---South side of Bayberry and south side of Bridge. This appeared to improve water movement but the ditches along Kent were also filled with water.
- Fixed sign at Kent Ave
- Repaired gates at Bayberry storage area

Tasks for Contractors:

- Route 1 median signs (\$3,500 plus DelDot fee \$7,000 total)
- Bridge Road entrance signs \$3,500 plus DelDot fee \$7,000 total)
- Landscaping Maintenance (Ruppert?)

- Pine straw, pruning, maintenance for Beach plum (between Evergreen and Bridge (\$1,425)

- Replace flag pole at 30A Dune (will be paid by 30 Dune)
- Blow out culverts on Pine side (\$250 per hour---Not a fixed fee)
- Correct ditch at 17-19 Short \$5,000
- Clean all ditches (in current Ruppert contract)
- Jet Seal
 - Dune Road & side streets \$10,785
 - Bayberry \$4,580
 - o Short \$3,460
 - All Streets between Route 1 & Beach Plum \$5,880

- Sandblast and recoat Polaris
- Turn off water to the guard house
- Drain hot water heater
- Add marine anti freeze to toilet
- Ballards for Short Road
- Finish guard house interior (sheet rock & paint)
- Repair guard house from accident
- Repair and maintenance of Route 1 fences and gates (east side of Route 1)
- Fence around Bayberry enclosure (in process)
- · Remove organic growth from ditches
- Turn on water to guard house
- Turn on water to foot washes
- Repair dune fencing at Addy

Asks for volunteers:

- New plantings for flower beds
- Trash enclosures (discussion about keeping or not)
- New bike racks

- Clear dune walkways, add clay base and prepare final grade (\$10,000 with volunteers)
- Sweep pavers on Dune walkways (not to remove clay base from pavers on the east side)
