As a reminder, an approved permit is required for any project (including repairs and maintenance) BEFORE work begins and only emergency work is permitted from July 1st until the Tuesday after Labor Day. Every property owner should refer to the website for all applicable rules and required permits before initiating any project. These rules apply to new construction, remodeling, renovation and/or major repairs, and tree work.

We have finalized the details of a contract for Landscaping Services for this year. This includes mowing, edging, mulching, and maintaining plantings. We work jointly with the Beautification Committee on these tasks.

The ditches will be cleaned this winter; and will be kept clean. Making sure the culverts are clear will assist the water flow westward and out of our community. To enhance the drainage of our ditches, we have been hydro jetting the culverts and removing sediment and debris. This process will continue during the upcoming year.

Short and Bayberry roads, on the Pine Side will be jet sealed. This process preserves surface of the road and extends the life of the pavement. Last year Beach Plum was jet sealed and jet sealing will, hopefully, remain as part of the annual road maintenance.

A group of volunteers, led by Marty & Nancy, have been replacing the trash receptacles on the beach walkways.
