COMMITTEE REPORTS

Beach Patrol

We are off and running for the 2023 summer. Things are off to a good start. We are fully staffed (one of the few on Delmarva) and the beach is running smoothly. A couple of quick updates:

- We have been running three stands during the week for Middlesex Beach. The budget-friendly staffing has been more than sufficient given the light crowds and cold weather. We will be going to full patrol on weekends and four stands the next two weeks. Coming into July 4th, we will have five stands, permanently.
- The shack is working out better than everyone expected. The bathroom and shower look great (the top of the shower was installed this week) and everyone seems pleased with the way it turned out. The recommendation for the off season is to extend the beach side roof for extra cover.
- The beach boxes have been built and put at the dune line, along with pull-up bars for the guards. Everything is well built but everything can be removed, which we will do in the fall. The money came out of our "equipment" budget, as we do not need a paddleboard this year.
- I asked Cathy, at Solutions Property Management, to review the insurance coverage for the guards and Middlesex Beach. Two concerns: (1) workers' compensation for the guards; and (2) who is covering them while they work at the Indian beaches. We have dealt with workers' compensation issues for competitions over the last two years. It was determined when two guards were hurt at competitions two years ago, they were covered. I am working under that assumption this year. To provide some clarity around that point, we will be paying the competitors one hours' worth of compensation to compete at the events. This will ensure that they are "on the clock." The other benefit is it will cover their entry fees for the competitions, which they were paying for themselves (which is not what we want). Competition season starts next week.
- Our first big event is the women's competition on 6/27. It's a big deal, as it is the only true women's only competition on Delmarva. Please have the Board encourage friends and neighbors to attend. T-shirts will be sold to raise funds for the guards so please bring your wallet! (By the way, the t-shirts are privately funded, and costs are taken out of proceeds to repay the seed money. Is there a better way to do this? They almost always sell out.)
- Thanks to those that had our umbrella signs made! You can imagine the smile on my face when I went out on the beach the other day, during a very sudden and hard south wind, and all the umbrellas were pointed in the right direction! It is now part of our protocol on high wind days and the signs help with that.

BBQ MEET AND GREET: Organized by Toni Wood and Nancy Glasgow took place on Saturday, May 27 and drew a large crowd of perhaps more than 150 people. The event was held on E. Bayberry due to strong winds on the beach. Tom Glasgow and Bob Wood prepared pulled pork and smoked brisket for the crowd, and community members brought plenty of side dishes and desserts. The lifeguards were introduced and mingled with homeowners. Musical entertainment was provided by Steel Happiness. These were sold for \$20 apiece, with any surplus over cost going to support lifeguard participation in out-of-town competitions. Total cost of the event was \$893.
